- 7. I'm glad you asked me that question because I couldn't be happier with the sound design of ÀSAKA. The work of José Luis Morales, the Canary, with the direct sound is perfect. And it was not easy at all. And Roberto HG's work with the final design is a complete marvel. The textures, the ambiences, the depths... please if you don't see it in a good room put on some good headphones and you will enjoy the special atmosphere designed for ÀSAKA.
